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Li has been walking with the assistance of crutches since kindergarten, and he's on his fifth pair now, but his physical disability doesn't change anything in the course of his life and schooling. With a fashionable pair of glasses and hairstyle, he looks just like so many other fresh-faced college students.

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As a software engineering major, Li found a way to earn his living expenses by joining a wechat team and prepare an online recharge business as a part-time job.

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"This is only my first attempt, and I'm going to do something new in college," said Li, revealing his positive attitude and strong personality.

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There have been national policies in terms helping the China's disabled community access higher education since 1985.

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With only one undergraduate school accepting physically disabled students at that time, many are frustrated about such a competitive environment.

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After the China Disabled Persons' Federation was founded in 1988, relevant supporting measures are gradually being seen.
