

《员工对视不能超过5秒钟，奈飞的新规太奇葩了》

Netflix has banned its workers from looking at each other for more than five seconds as part of new bizarre no-flirting rules.

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The company's film crew can also reportedly no longer ask their colleagues for their phone numbers and staff are encouraged to shout: 'Stop! Don't do that again', if they feel harassed.

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It follows the Harvey Weinstein scandal and Me Too movement that has hit Hollywood.

One of the first programmes made to follow these instructions is sci-fi series Black Mirror, filmed in London and on location.

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An on-set runner said: 'Senior staff went to a harassment meeting to learn what is and isn't appropriate. Looking at anyone longer than five seconds is considered creepy.

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'You mustn't ask for someone's number unless they have given permission for it to be distributed. And if you see any unwanted behaviour, report it immediately,' the Sun report.

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'It has sparked jokes, with people looking at each other, counting to five, then diverting their eyes.'

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Employees of the online streaming service were also urged not to prolong hugs or ask people out more than once and to avoid those who said no.

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
