例句：The courier delivered the package to the customer's doorstep.

例句：The suspect denied any involvement in the crime.

例句：Pollution is endangering the health of the river ecosystem.

例句：Reading extensively enriches one's vocabulary and knowledge.

例句：The student promptly enrolled in the new course after hearing about it.

例句：The author entitled her book "The Quest for Truth" to reflect its themes.
